Q: Who are the Faculty/Major advisors?

A: Professors: Bailes, Beller, Horowitz, Holman, McKinney, Flora, Nesbitt, and Rodning. Professor Jack is the point person.

Q: What is the process for declaring majors?

A: They must bring Transfer Credit Approval form with an academic advisor's signature, the course syllabus, and course description to their assigned EVST advisor for approval.

Q: What is the process for transfer credit?

A: They must bring Transfer Credit Approval form with an academic advisor's signature, the course syllabus, and course description to Professor Jack.

Q: Where do students often study abroad?

A: All over the world (Latin America, Australia, New Zealand, South Africa, Copenhagen, etc.). Meet with study abroad office for more information. Students should note that only two courses can be transferred in to the EVST degree from outside Tulane.

Q: What classes can students take within this major to fill the public service requirement?

A: Students do internships through the Center for Public Service or complete the EVST summer program.
