GENERAL INFORMATION

- Gain relevant experience through part-time and summer jobs , volunteer work or internships.
- Get involved in student professional or cultural associations.
- Build and utilize a personal network of contacts. Once in a position, find an experienced mentor.
- Participate in an exchange program or or study abroad program.
- Increase your familiarity with the Greek language and culture by watching Greek movies, listening to Greek broadcasts or reading Greek newspapers, magazines and books.
- Consider choosing an additional academic area of study to supplement the foreign language. Many people with foreign language ability use those skills to assist them in a different career field such as business, education, technology, etc.
- Volunteer your language skills to churches, community organizations and programs that work with people who speak Greek.
