- Increase your familiarity with the Latin language and culture by watching Latin movies, listening to Latin broadcasts or reading Latin newspapers, magazines and books.
- Consider choosing an additional academic area of study to supplement the foreign language. Many people with foreign language ability use those skills to assist them in a different career field such as business, education, technology, etc.
- Volunteer your language skills to churches, community organizations and programs that work with people who speak Latin.

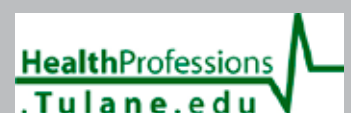
