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**Q: Who are the Faculty/Major advisors?**

A. Professor Michael Brumbaugh (fall 2015) and Ryan Boehm (spring 2016) is the Undergraduate Advisor, but all majors are also assigned an individual faculty major advisor.

**Q: Where do students often study abroad?**

A. Most often in Rome, Italy, or Athens, Greece, but also in Australia, Denmark, New Zealand, and the United Kingdom.

**Q: What classes can students take within this major to fill the public service requirement?**

A. CLAS 3090, CLAS 3170, and CLAS 4080 usually have service learning components, and some of our faculty also teach service learning TIDE courses.

**Q: Does TU have a graduate program in this area? Does your office have information on grad programs at other schools?**

A. Yes, we offer a Master of Arts. Information about graduate programs at other institutions is available in our department. Students should consult their major advisors and our department's Graduate Advisor.

**Q: Are there any clubs affiliated with this program?**

A. Yes, the Classics Club and Eta Sigma Phi Honor Society.

**Q: Are there any places around the city that you would recommend for students to continue learning outside the classroom (i.e., museums, upcoming conferences, or speakers)?**

A. The department offers various lectures throughout the school year including our annual Georges Lecture in Hellenic culture every spring. Also, check out the New Orleans Society of the Archaeological Institute of America.

**Q: What internships/work study/summer programs do you know about?**

A. Students in classics have attended summer programs for intensive language study, the American School of Classical Studies Summer Session in Athens, and archaeological field schools for credit.

**Q: What is the process for declaring majors/minors?**

A. Students must submit the Major/Minor Declaration form to Prof. Michael Brumbaugh (fall 2015) and Ryan Boehm (spring 2016).

**Q: What is the process for transfer credit?**

A. Students must submit a Transfer Credit Approval form and course description (and syllabus, if available) to Prof. Michael Brumbaugh (fall 2015) and Ryan Boehm (spring 2016) for evaluation BEFORE taking courses outside of Tulane University.
