Q: Who are the Faculty/Major Advisors?

A: Professors Alison Denham (on leave F '15), Bruce Brower, Jonathan Riley, Daniel Burnston, and Kevin Morris

Q: What is the process for declaring majors/minors?

A: Students interested should contact Professor Brower, chair of the department at bbrower@tulane.edu to set up an appointment.

Q: What is the process for transfer credit?

A: Submit signed Transfer Credit Approval form (academic advisor's signature) and syllabus to Professor Brower. Students should always get the course pre-approved. Students sometimes take logic at another school and assume it will transfer as symbolic logic.

Q: Where do students often study abroad?

A: Students often study in England, Scotland, Australia, Germany, and elsewhere in Europe. Study in Asia and Africa rarely offers courses that can transfer.

Q: What classes can students take within this major to fill the public service requirement?

A: PHIL 1210, PHIL 3340, PHIL 3500, and PHIL 6130. Public Service availability varies with instructor.

Q: Does TU have a graduate program in this area? Does your office have information on grad programs at other schools?

A: Yes, the department has a graduate program. Please consult the chair and other faculty members about graduate schools for philosophy. The department also offers a 4+1 graduate program that allows Tulane undergraduates to receive an M.A. with one additional year of study. Please consult with the chair about the appropriate courses to take as an undergraduate to enter the program.

Q: Are there any clubs affiliated with this program?

A: The Philosophy club holds meetings about every 2 weeks and has had over 30 faculty, student, alumni presenters and discussants during the last three years. Kevin Morris is the Faculty Advisor (kmorris4@tulane.edu). The club email address is (Tulane.philosophy.club@gmail.com).
