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**Q: Who are the Faculty/Major advisors?**

A: Different faculty members are assigned as advisors.

**Q: What is the process for declaring majors/minors?**

A: Students bring the Major/Minor form to the department to have it signed by the department chair and then by the advisor that has been assigned to them.

**Q: What is the process for transfer credit?**

A: Students bring the Transfer Credit Approval form with the academic advisor's signature along with a copy of the syllabus or course description to the secretary who will give it to the department chair who will decide and the form is picked up by the student.

**Q: Where do students often study abroad?**

A: Students study in France, Czech Republic, and Spain.

**Q: What classes can students take within this major to fill the public service requirement?**

A: Students can take: SOCI 1050/1891-11; SOCI 1300/1890-01; SOCI 1300/1893-01; SOCI 6300/6891-11; SOCI 6330/6892-01, and others please contact the department.

**Q: Does TU have a graduate program in this area? Does your office have information on grad programs at other schools?**

A: Presently, our only graduate program is a PHD for the degree of, City, Culture, and Community, which was started in fall 2011. We have an American Sociological Association "Guide to Graduate Departments of Sociology" that we keep in our office and we display any information sent to us from other schools off campus.

**Q: Are there any clubs affiliated with this program?**

A: We have the Sociology Club and AKD Honor Society (for Sociology).

**Q: Are there any places around the city that you would recommend for students to continue learning outside the classroom (i.e. museums, upcoming conferences or speakers)?**

A: Students could visit the World War II Museum, New Orleans Museum of Art, and take a guided tour of the French Quarter.
